About Pechersk School International (PSI Kyiv)



PSI Kyiv is a dynamic international school offering the IB continuum of the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Middle Years Programme (MYP) and the Diploma Programme (DP) to our learners. Our beautiful school and its community have been dramatically impacted by the full-scale invasion within the borders of our host country, Ukraine.

Following a remarkable 2022-2023 school year of operating from the grounds of the American School of Warsaw, **PSI returned to its home in Kyiv, Ukraine**. In the 2023-2024 school year, we maintain two communities as one: a student body fully integrated into learning at ASW and one student body attending face-to-face learning in Kyiv, Ukraine, at our home campus. This option allows us to continue providing support to our families who remain in Poland and hopefully will be able to return to Ukraine in the foreseeable future.





We are seeking outstanding educators who possess a strong desire to support Ukraine in its rebuilding efforts. A thriving international school is key to Ukraine's future.

All of our new hires will be very special people who are driven by the wonderful opportunity to join our extraordinary team and supportive and caring community.

History of the school



Parents seeking a genuinely international education for their children founded PSI as a private, non-profit school in 1995 with 60 students. PSI has always offered international and local families in Kyiv a world-class education, with English as the language of instruction.

Before the full-scale invasion of Ukraine, we had reached almost 550 students, with 70% of the student population from the overseas diplomatic, government, and business communities.

- 2000 PSI is an IB World School (offers three IB programmes)
- 2002 PSI received its first accreditation from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) and Council of International Schools (CIS)
- 2017 PSI New Phase 2 building completed
- February 2022 PSI was forced to close its campus in Kyiv due to the beginning of a full-scale war in Ukraine
- August 2022 PSI opened its temporary satellite campus for face-to-face learning in Warsaw (in partnership with ASW) and launched online learning (in partnership with Avenues Online) for students remaining in Ukraine
- Spring 2023 PSI has been awarded renewed accreditation status by NEASC and IB as part of the Collaborative Learning Protocol process
- August 2023 PSI has re-opened its campus in Kyiv, Ukraine


Diversity Statement

Facilities & Safety



Our campus comprises three blocks, dedicated to both Primary and Secondary divisions. These facilities include specialised spaces such as an auditorium, gymnasium, theatre black box, swimming pool, dance studio, welcoming cafe, and a covered pitch. Additionally, just a two-minute walk away, our athletics track and football field offer further recreational options.

Safety & Emergency Preparedness

Ensuring the safety of our students and staff is a top priority at Pechersk School International. The campus is equipped with authorized bomb shelter spaces, meeting official standards. These spaces, located in the basement areas, are thoughtfully decorated to provide a comfortable learning environment during any unforeseen situations. We have also invested in a state-of-the-art generator to guarantee uninterrupted energy supplies in case of disruptions.





Security Measures

Our commitment to safety extends to the presence of a dedicated security team, strategically positioned CCTV cameras along the perimeters, and a secure entrance system utilizing a security card. These measures collectively contribute to a secure and protected environment for everyone on campus.
