SWIS modestly opened its doors in 2011 with one Nursery and one Pre-Kindergarten class with a total of 36 students. Since then, SWIS has grown into a dynamic learning community of over 1050 students from Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12.

School Profile



Shen Wai International School (SWIS) is located in the beautiful scenery of the Shenzhen Bay. Invested by Shenzhen Municipal Government, SWIS covers a floor area of 24,000 m2 with a construction area of 42,000 m2 and is equipped with extensive first-class facilities. It serves children of the expatriate community who work in Shenzhen and children who are permanent residents of Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan. The school altogether has 54 classrooms with a capacity of hosting 1,080 students in total.

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SWIS was also accredited by the Council of International Schools (CIS) and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) in 2017. SWIS was awarded membership in EARCOS and ACAMIS in 2018. SWIS aims to provide distinctive high-quality education to students by employing talented expat teachers and introducing the International Baccalaureate curriculum, teaching models, and management patterns.



Teaching Team

SWIS has a strong faculty and management team, with teachers from 18 different countries and regions who have substantial experience. The teaching will be in small classes led by certified expat teachers with international teaching experience, and qualified Chinese co-teachers.

Professional Development

SWIS provides opportunities for all teachers to participate in Professional Development (PD) by either taking part in external PD or working with trainers during in-school workshops. Our teachers have access to a wide variety of IB workshops to further enhance their teaching and learning skills and continue to provide authentic and engaging learning opportunities for our students.

- Assessing, and when necessary, developing curricular programs to meet the learning need of SWIS students.
- Effectively using data to assess programs.
- Managing the Early Years & Primary Division in accordance with the school policies and guidelines.
- Facilitating the school's interactions with parents and others in the school community.
- Recruiting and retaining highly qualified teaching staff.

Required Qualifications

The successful candidate must have:

- A minimum of three to five years of experience leading an academic division or related leadership role in an international school setting.
- An advanced degree in education or educational administration.
- Leadership experience in the IB PYP curriculum highly preferred.
- Experience in education as a classroom teacher.
- Demonstrated experience in developing successful and supportive relationships with students, parents and teaching staff.
- A demonstrated commitment to continuous professional development.
- Experience in an Asian setting highly preferred.

- An ability to creatively and collaboratively solve problems.
- An ability to positively energize and nurture the school community.
- An ability to listen to input from all school stakeholders, make timely decisions and communicate them clearly.
- A demonstrated knowledge and appreciation of the host culture.
