The ISS Mary Anne Haas Women's Symposium brings together approximately two dozen women leaders from around the globe each summer to meet, discuss the context for women leadership in international schools, network, and further their own professional development in a stimulating series of workshops and conversations.

Supported through a generous grant from the Office of Overseas Schools at the US Department of State, as well as key sponsors, this annual symposium helps advance women educators in leadership in international schools – and provides important role models to future generations of women leaders.


While this symposium is in its 18th year, it is continually evolving. This school year, the dialogue has expanded to a more global stage—through regional conference presentations, live streaming, social media, and shareable video clips—all designed to extend the impact of the symposium by sharing participants' insights and learnings with the larger educational community.

GROWING THE PIPELINE

While the diversity of the gender, race and ethnicity of international school leadership continues to increase, there is still room for further progress.

Since most heads follow (a common) career path, it's essential that a sufficient number of (diverse) educators persist through each step in order to ensure an adequate supply of head candidates. To that end, everyone in the latter stages of the education pipeline has a responsibility to mentor and sponsor their more junior colleagues.

ABOUT THE FOUNDER: MARY ANNE HAAS

Mary Anne Haas has been a force in international education since the 1960s. At the youthful age of 94, she continues to inspire the global educational community.

Mary Anne and her husband Stanley Haas provided leadership, fellowship and fun to international school communities in Rome and Athens and through the Near East South Asia (NESA) Council of International Schools in her early days and then spent more than 20 years at International Schools Services (ISS).

In 2002, Mary Anne founded the ISS Women's Symposium, an annual event in Princeton to develop and support women leaders in international education. In 2016 the event was renamed the ISS Mary Anne Haas Women's Symposium, in her honor. She retired at age 90, but continues to be a vibrant voice in education.

Mary Anne has a passion for learning, an interest in other cultures, a commitment to service, and an infectious optimism for the future. Her sense of adventure, color, and design are legendary among the international school community.
