POSITION OVERVIEW

In collaboration with the School Director and the Leadership Team, the Pretoria School Principal's role is to manage the division Pre-K through grade 8. The Principal is accountable for the effective development, delivery, and evaluation of the school's educational programs. In exercising this responsibility, the Pretoria Principal is required to make important decisions regarding the program, budget, and staff that lie within their jurisdiction of the whole school's plan. The management of the school's programs requires the Pretoria Principal to analyze the needs of the students to ultimately transform the educational structures into the most promising teaching program with respect to the AISJ's guiding statements and strategic direction of the school. The initial post is for three years with the potential for extension.

SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

The American International School of Johannesburg (AISJ) is a Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12 coeducational school founded in 1982. It offers a standards-based curriculum that develops the understanding, knowledge, and skills base for all students to be successful. AISJ strives to offer a diverse and balanced program across the Four Pillars of Academics, Athletics, the Arts, and Service. The school is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools in the United States. It is also a member of the Association for the Advancement of International Education (AAIE), the Association of International Schools in Africa (AISA), and the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO).

The school comprises two campuses. The Pretoria Campus serves Pre-K through grade 8 and the nearby Johannesburg Campus serves Pre-K through grade 12. The Pretoria Campus works closely with the Johannesburg Elementary and Middle Schools while retaining its own intimate atmosphere.

The Pretoria Campus offers an American/international curriculum that is strongly inquiry and conceptually driven, leading to an IB Diploma Program and an American High School Diploma Program on the Johannesburg Campus. A highly committed staff of local and international teachers, administrators, and support staff make the school a warm and welcoming environment for students and parents alike. The Pretoria Campus currently has a faculty of 40 resulting in a staff/student ratio of less than 1:7; this includes a Principal and a full-time Counselor. With students from over 100 countries and no single nationality forming a majority, the school is truly diverse in culture, background, and perspectives. The school has a history of service-learning that is integrated into the curriculum across all grades and is a graduation requirement of the High School.

History

AISJ was founded in 1982 to serve the needs of the expatriate community in Johannesburg. In 1984, it settled in the current Johannesburg location in the northern suburbs set on almost 80 acres of undulating grounds overlooking greater Johannesburg. In August 2002, AISJ opened the Pretoria Campus to accommodate an increasing expatriate population in the northern city which is the diplomatic capital of South Africa. The school initially served 14 students in grades K-2 and was housed in a single building, but the campus experienced rapid growth of at least 10-15% a year and quickly outgrew the space. AISJ purchased and redeveloped a new facility in late 2010 to expand both classrooms and programs. The Pretoria Campus opened in August 2011, allowing greater definition of the elementary and middle school sections and broader elective and extra-curricular activities. The strategic vision for the campus is that it will remain Pre-K through grade 8 with a capacity of 300. While the school has grown up in many ways, the intimate, family feel of a neighborhood school remains its hallmark.

Location

Pretoria is the diplomatic capital of South Africa and has the second-highest number of high commissions and embassies in the world, so it is not surprising that the school attracts a diverse array of students. Pretoria is known as the 'Jacaranda City' featuring many jacaranda tree-lined boulevards and stately government



buildings. It is renowned for its pleasant and temperate year-round climate. The city is located midway between the ancient Magaliesberg hills to the northwest and the cosmopolitan metropolis of Johannesburg to the southeast. A short drive away lies the historic Cradle of Humankind World Heritage Site, and the city is in close proximity to game parks and expansive recreational areas.

The picturesque Pretoria Campus is set on a spacious 5.9 acres with magnificently landscaped gardens, inviting the kind of school-without-walls learning opportunities for which the South African climate is perfect. The facilities include 25 classrooms, 2 science labs, a multipurpose center that offers both an indoor gymnasium and theater, a library media center, a maker space, a learning support center, an additional undercover assembly area with a stage, 2 swimming pools, a cafeteria, a dual-purpose tennis/basketball area, a synthetic soccer field, playground areas, a community garden, and a parent room.

Student Body

Current enrollment on both campuses is 900 students. The Pretoria Campus currently enrolls approximately 160 Pre-K through grade 5 students in the Elementary school and 80 students in the Middle school. The Pretoria Campus has a total capacity of 330 students and the maximum capacity of both campuses is approximately 1400.

The Pretoria Principal will be part of the AISJ Leadership Team along with the School Director, divisional Principals, Head of Teaching and Learning, and the Director of Operations.

- Oversee program offerings and ensure appropriate scope and sequence of courses.
- Assist and support the School Director in the recruitment of appropriate staff.
- Assign, organize, and monitor staff for the greatest effect in accomplishing the purpose of the school.
- Ensure collaborative development of divisional, departmental, and individual professional goals.
- Continue the development of a strong culture of professional growth through dynamic support, supervision, and evaluation of elementary teachers and instructional support staff
- Promote a collaborative and cohesive learning culture.



- Ensure that all decisions and processes have student learning as the focus and goal.
- Facilitate the development of a school climate that appropriately meets the social and emotional needs of elementary students.
- Provide clear protocols and processes to ensure there is regular, quality communication between school and home.
- Ensure that student performance data is used to improve programs and student learning.
- Manage and further develop a vibrant and sustainable service learning program.
- Ensure appropriate balance, rigor, and support for academics, arts, activities, athletics, and service learning programs.

- Perform other tasks as assigned by the School Director.
