

Introduction to Dar Essalam American School

Dar Essalam American School (DAS) is an independent, English-medium, Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 9 international school in Rabat, Morocco, with the goal of providing a high-quality education to a diverse student body. Grades 10 to 12 will be added in subsequent years. The School has partnered with Lumo Education and International Schools Services (ISS) to develop an innovative curriculum that draws from the best of Finnish and American pedagogy and curricula to deliver a student-centered, enriching, and challenging program that prepares students for lifelong success.

The parent company is a private Moroccan holding company that supports economic and social development in Morocco through impact-driven and job-creating investments. It draws on substantial resources to design and build a world-class campus with state-of-the-art athletic, visual, performing arts facilities, a black box theater, innovative technology and design thinking spaces, a maker space, and abundant green areas. The school opened in September 2022.

Governance

DAS is governed by a five-member Bord of Directors with membership that includes representatives from both International Schools Services and Lumo Education.

Administration

The school is structured with Early Years (Pre-K3&4 and KG), Elementary School (Grade 1 to Grade 5), Middle School (Grades 6 to 8), and High School (Grades 9-12). Senior leadership includes the Head of School, and Elementary and Secondary Principals.

Accreditation

DAS is completing its application for candidacy status with New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) with expected accreditation in its fourth year of operation.

Academic Calendar

The school operates on a typical North American calendar which runs from late August to June each academic year.

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Curriculum & Academic Program

The curriculum has been collaboratively developed by Lumo-ISS and is based on American standards and enhanced with Finnish outcomes for Pre-Kinder to Grade 10. Additionally, the school will prepare to deliver a rigorous internationally-minded program of studies in 11th and 12th grade. The American Common Core Standards are used as a basis for the school's curriculum which is delivered through the highly successful Finnish pedagogical approach.

The Pre-K to Grade 12 curriculum is built from horizontally and vertically aligned standards, the same set of standards to ensure a cohesive learning journey and high academic achievement. The curriculum has been developed for the whole child with learning goals focused on the development of each child's conceptual learning, competency learning, and skills development. Following a standards-based curriculum, the learning objectives identify what is most meaningful and helpful for students to learn at each developmental stage or age. Students explore inquiry-based projects to identify personal goals and interests that are aligned with the expected academic goals. This takes place through explicit and individualized instruction, independent study, collaborative team studies and expeditions, and class field trips that engage the local Moroccan community. The college preparatory program will meet those specifically required by higher education institutions in the United States and other international destinations.

Finnish American Program

The educational program is a unique blend of American and Finnish curricula and pedagogical approaches. By combining the best pedagogy, protocols, and practices together with all stakeholders involved in the child's learning, we ensure the authenticity and student centeredness in education. Individualized learning supports the student's skill development, academic progress, and holistic well-being.

Students

DAS is designed for families and students who desire a private school education with an innovative international-style educational program that draws from the best of the Finnish and American educational systems. Additionally, families seek the kind of amenities at the school that allows their children to choose opportunities such as athletics, fine arts, clubs and more. Students are drawn from Rabat within a 25-km radius of the school location. They come from families of the expatriate and Moroccan professional population who seek a high-quality educational program that allow greater choice of post-secondary opportunities outside of Morocco for their children.

Faculty

DAS faculty are drawn from several countries around the world including Morocco, Finland, the US, the UK, Australia, Colombia and Canada. It is required that all teachers be certified to teach their school division or content area. The faculty's pedagogical staff is supported by Principals and professional development and quality assurance specialists from ISS and Lumo both remotely and on-site. DAS is committed to hiring experienced, certified and talented instructors in Math, English, Science, and Social Studies as well Life X-perience, music, physical education and well-being, visual arts, and makerspace and design thinking. DAS is committed to strong Arabic and French curricula that is taught by experienced Arab and French language teachers.

Facilities

Dar Essalam American School has facilities to accommodate and help students thrive. The school provides quality facilities to support and enhance education and co-curricular activities. They include a full-size soccer pitch, makerspace, black box theater, science labs, music and practice rooms, pool, weight room, library media center, Life X-perience lab, gymnasium, fully equipped playgrounds, and more.

Location

DAS is conveniently located in the upscale Hay Riad district of Rabat and is only minutes from downtown.





Boarding Program

DAS's boarding program will most likely commence in 2024 and accommodate secondary Moroccan students from outside of Rabat and students from other countries. This is an attempt to build diversity in the school and expose day students to other cultures in keeping with its international identity. A critical factor in the planning of the boarding program will be the integration of the Secondary boarding students with the Secondary day students into one cohesive community. The boarding program will follow the elements of a rich, comprehensive design reflecting best boarding practices in staffing, curriculum, policies, facilities, and marketing. The boarding curriculum will include life skills, character education, and leadership skills

What is the connection between Lumo-ISS and DAS?

International Schools Services and Lumo Education have been working closely with EDC and the school leadership since July 2020 in the areas of curriculum development, recruiting, staff training, governance, and facilities and organizational development. ISS provides access to, and development of, curriculum using the Atlas Rubicon curriculum mapping software. Additional development of instructional practices and pedagogy is also supported by Lumo-ISS. In addition to conducting the search for this Head of School position, Lumo-ISS supports the school in hiring teachers for DAS.

Head of School Job Description

Position: Head of School

Reports To: DAS Board Chair and ISS Senior Leadership Executive Working Relationships: Management Team, Leadership Team, Faculty

Overview

Dar Essalam American School (DAS) is seeking a proven leader who will support the continued emergence of a positive school culture that upholds the key elements of the educational program and promotes DAS in the community as a truly innovative international school.

The Head of School shall be a native English speaker whose qualifications include professional assignments as an administrator in international schools. The Head of School shall be appointed by the Board of Directors. The Head of School shall attend and participate in the meetings of the Board of Directors as a non-voting member. The Head of School shall meet the requirements to fill the position as prescribed by Lumo-ISS.

Description

The Head of School is responsible for the effective general management of the school, for ensuring the provision of academic leadership and strategic vision, and for the quality of the student experience. The Head of School is responsible for proposing an annual budget and submitting it to the Board of Directors for review and approval. In addition, the Head of School is responsible for monitoring the budget and ensuring that resources are allocated per the approved budget. The Head of School is responsible for ensuring the school is in compliance with all the local laws and regulations and with the requirements of the school's accrediting agency (NEASC) and any authorization requirements.

Responsibilities

Strategic and Budgetary Planning

- Developing a strategic plan for the School, in consultation with the Board of Directors, including the preparation of a staffing and resource plan
- Engaging the staff of the school in compiling and implementing the school's plan
- Reviewing the performance of the school in terms of its objectives as stated in its strategic plan and in its staffing and resource plan
- Having responsibility for all financial matters, including financial planning and sustainability, resource allocation, the identification of new sources of income, the monitoring of expenditure to ensure that it is within appropriate levels, ensuring the linking of resource allocation to strategic and operational planning
- Managing and monitoring of the implementation of the budget

Educational Leadership and Planning

- Assume leadership of the educational leadership team to meet regularly, analyze the needs of the school, and address the needs of the school systematically
- Develop an educational improvement plan, along with the Chair, Superintendent, and educational leaders, including the preparation of a staffing and resource plan

- Engage the educational leadership of the school in compiling and implementing the school's plan in accordance with the recommendations of ministry, accrediting bodies, and relevant consultants
- Monitor and improve the performance of the school in terms of its objectives as stated in its educational improvement plan
- Supervise and evaluate the educational leadership team members to build capacity for sustained effective leadership of school improvement

Staffing

- Leading educational staffing and leadership/teacher recruitment efforts in collaboration with HR and Principals
- Creating a supportive working environment for all staff in the school and fostering their career development
- Ensuring that staff performance reviews are completed in a timely manner
- Allocating duties to staff within the school and the management of staff in accordance with policies and procedures
- Handling grievance procedures for staff except where a grievance is against the Head of School
- Managing relevant disciplinary procedures for both staff and students

Teaching and Learning

- Taking overall responsibility for the adoption, alignment, and management of the school's program of teaching and learning
- Ensuring the effective delivery of high-quality teaching and the maintenance of academic standards
- Promoting a culture of learning that is directed to student needs and holistic well-being
- Collaborating closely with the school's Principals (substitute protocols, pedagogical issues, structures, etc.)
- Assuring that the school maintains good standing with its accreditation agency and the International Baccalaureate
- Fostering interdisciplinary collaboration both within the school and with other schools and regional organizations
- Promoting excellence and improvement in all matters of teaching and learning
- Ensuring the regular review, evaluation and development of programs offered by the school

General

- Representing the school both internally and externally
- Implement a high-quality boarding program that fosters physical, social-emotional, academic, and intellectual development of all students
- Managing and encouraging an information flow to staff, parents, and students in the school community
- Ensuring the effective operation of the school in accordance with approved governance procedures
- Overseeing the general management and maintenance of the school's physical facilities and equipment, including the allocation of rooms and other space



- Having overall responsibility for ensuring that the school complies with legal requirements and related policies
- Implementing decisions of the Board of Directors and supplying information in accordance with board policy

- Other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors

While the initial contract will be for a period of three years, it is the hope and expectation of the Board of Directors that at the end of that time it will be mutually desirable to extend it.
