## Desired Qualities and Qualifications

The effect occurs through an intermediate between teaching and learning, which is the thinking processes, that happens within the learner. Madac is known for its positive environment and display of values. The entire community is upbeat because across the school, from the guard to the leadership, respect, and values are present. ## Core Values

"Madac" is keen on planting the seeds of the comprehensive values of the Holy Qur'an into the souls of our children, so we focus on 7 main values, all of which stem from verses that begin with, "God loves those who..."

- Are pious: (PIETY), so that the learners bring about all that is useful for them and for humanity while rejecting all that is harmful to them and for humanity.
- Are altruistic, (ALTRUISM) so that the learners become active agents for positive change in their own lives, in the lives of others, and in the world around them. Altruism is about giving, and "Madacians" have the spirit of giving.
- Are patient (PATIENCE), so that the learners are enthusiastic about learning, and have everlasting persistence.
- Are repentant (REPENTANCE), so that the learners understand their strengths and weaknesses, develop themselves, help others grow, and reform themselves regularly through reflection and other ways.
- **Rely on God (RELIANCE)**, so that learners put their trust in God and learn independence, and rely on themselves. They learn to be creative, not imitators, and they seek objectivity.
- Are pure (PURITY), so that the learners can express themselves appropriately, with principles, confidence, and innovation, in several languages and ways. Purity for our younger learners begins with physical purity and leads to a greater understanding with time to purity of the heart.
- Are just (JUSTICE), so that the learners balance the different aspects of their intellectual, physical, and emotional life, to achieve happiness and welfare for themselves and others. They are communicative and listen to the points of view of other individuals or groups. They take fair actions.

#### Accreditation

Madac Schools obtained the International Baccalaureate accreditation for the primary stage (unconditional four-year accreditation). The International Baccalaureate Organization has selected Madac schools from among 5,000 schools to participate and present at the International Baccalaureate Conference.

#### Governance

The school is managed by a Board chaired by H. R. H Prince Faisal bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud. Various committees are in place that oversee the development of the school. There are currently 10 newly appointed Board members.

#### Curriculum

The Program of Inquiry (POI) shows the continuum of student learning across their years in the PYP and MYP. It includes the Unit Names and descriptions, central ideas, lines of inquiry, key and related concepts, skills, Madac values, and IB learner Profile attributes that students will learn in every unit.

## Academic Calendar

The school year runs from the end of August to the end of June.





## The Academic Program

Madac ensures that students are challenged in all areas of their learning and that the whole student/learner is developed. Differentiation techniques are used to ensure that students are challenged and given chances to develop. Madac believes that 21st-century teaching and learning requires new and modern strategies, and the focus of learning should be on understanding and building life skills. Education must reach all learners through differentiation and help learners develop a love for lifelong learning.

To implement the IB Program at Madac, students learn through inquiry. Trained IB teachers deliver the program, focusing on local issues first, and then moving further out to international and global issues. Students take with them not only content knowledge but conceptual knowledge and skills that carry with them throughout their lives. Teachers use various strategies in the classroom and outside to ensure learning and growth are witnessed in every student. Students go on field trips and

are visited by parents and community visitors who help them make relevant connections to their learning in the classroom.

## Early Years/ Elementary

The Primary Years Program (PYP) at Madac is for Students ages 3 – 10 (KG1 to Grade 5). The IB Learner profile develops well-rounded and internationally minded students. The curriculum is transdisciplinary, meaning it goes beyond subject areas. The curriculum framework includes four elements:





knowledge, concepts, skills, and action. The PYP is arranged according to a written, taught, and assessed curriculum. The PYP prepares students to become active, caring, lifelong learners who demonstrate respect for themselves and others and can participate in the world around them. The PYP focuses on the development of the whole Student as an inquirer, both within and beyond the classroom.

#### Middle School

The MYP Program at Madac is for Students ages 11 to 13 (Grades 6 to 8). It aims to develop active learners and internationally minded young people who can empathize with others and pursue lives of purpose and meaning. The program empowers students to inquire into a wide range of issues and ideas of significance locally, nationally, and globally. The result is young people who are creative, critical, and reflective thinkers.



### High School

Our High School section will open in 2024, welcoming our first grade 9 classes. Grades 9 and 10 will be a continuation of the MYP Program. The school will also introduce the American High School Diploma course work with objective of providing the possibility of three qualifications to our prospective graduates: The IB Diploma, the IB Bilingual Diploma and the American High School Diploma. The school is co-educational with integrated classes KG1 to KG3 (boys and girls) separate classroom but within the girls' section grades 1 to 3, and segregated classes grades 4 and up.

## Arts, Athletics, & After School Activities

Madac offers an after-school activities program. Students are encouraged to participate in activities to further develop skills, hobbies, and talents. Activities are provided by teachers of Madac and external providers. Teachers offer activities of interest, those they are passionate about, so that they are delivered professionally and with love. Madac also participates in all regional and national academic competitions. For Academic year 2023/24, the school has won all regional competitions and was placed as one of the top 3 schools, in its age category, within the kingdom of Saudi Arabia.







## The Learning Environment

Madac is described as a balanced environment that provides students with learning through the latest educational strategies, contemporary experiments, and regional and international practices in the field of education. They ensure learners have features of intellectual thinkers and distinctive leaders who possess remarkable scientific and practical knowledge, concepts, skills, and abilities.





Madac creates a unique educational experience for students, by delivering the best class and extracurricular activities and using the most modern educational techniques, and enriching the following generations, by adopting a cutting-edge international curriculum for inquiry learning and exploration. Their goal is to enrich the educational curriculums with the latest scientific and literary trends such as Nanotechnology, space crafts, astronomy, meteorology, energy, environment, economy, poetry, prose, calligraphy, drawing, etc. Highly qualified

educators provide educational, psychological, academic, and vocational guidance to support the personal development of students.






## Campus

#### Facilities & Premises

There is no doubt that the physical environment has a great effect on learning outcomes. Since Madac's education is holistic it concentrates on the whole person from all aspects, academic, social, physical, and psychological. The classroom setting must assist in achieving those goals. The classrooms are spacious, about 72 square meters, with plenty of natural light and the use of natural materials. The current school is part of a larger vision with "Phase 1" to be completed in August 2023. These new facilities will include, dedicated STEAM and Art Rooms a theatre and library, two gymnasiums, pools, and external play areas. "Phase 2" of the project (Est. start date May 2024) will see the construction of a second school (boys' school) a new kindergarten, administrative offices, and a community/training center.

#### Living in Medina

Situated north of Mecca, Medina is Saudi Arabia's second most holy city. Also known as Madinat Al-Nabi, or "The City of the Prophet", it is the burial place of the Prophet Muhammad. The Prophet's Mosque, which was built by Muhammad, is known as one of the largest mosques in the world, while the Quba Mosque is famous for being the oldest mosque in the world. For Muslims living in Medina, life is similar to that in any other Saudi city. Life in Medina is centered on the mosque of the prophet. There are cinemas, traditional cultural venues, art shows and all the benefits of living in a large and expanding city.



The city is also 1 hour and 30 minutes by TGV to Jeddah and Mekka and has links with exclusive tourist attractions such as Al Alula and Neom.
