




GROWING THE PIPELINE

ABOUT THE FOUNDER: MARY ANNE HAAS


Mary Anne Haas has been a force in international education since the 1960s. At a youthful age of 92, she continues to inspire the global educational community.

Mary Anne and her husband Stanley Haas provided leadership, fellowship and fun to international school communities in Rome and Athens and through the Near East South Asia (NESA) Council of International Schools in her early days and then spent more than 20 years at International Schools Services (ISS).

In 2002, she founded the ISS Women's Symposium, an annual event in Princeton to develop and support women leaders in international education. In the event was renamed the Mary Anne Haas ISS Women's Symposium, in her honor. She retired at age 90, but continues to be a vibrant voice in education.

Mary Anne has a passion for learning, an interest in other cultures, a commitment to service and an infectious optimism for the future. Her sense of adventure, color, and design are legendary among the international school community.
